I want to take this opportunity to remind our members that CCF REQUIRES every pilot to have a fire extinguisher out and ready to be used in an emergency, please don't leave it in your car. If there is a fire, seconds count and if there is an emergency everyone should take action to protect our field. Please also remember to not cross the double yellow line with flying. Don't fly over the motor cycle tracks when they are being used and don't fly near any of the power lines. We've had a few close calls recently and we must all do our part to protect each other and the field. That said, it's time to get out and fly!

CCF recently submitted to the AMA (now officially a CBO) our FAA FRIA application. We expect our app to be approved at some point this year and when it is and Deleo Field is an FAA-Recognized Identification Area, we'll be able to fly at Deleo without having to worry about the FAA and their Remote ID module requirement that goes into effect in September of this year.

We are discussing hosting another club event this year though nothing has been finalized. There is also a lot of interest in doing another night fly. We'll keep you posted and continue to watch the CCF Facebook page for updates.



At CCF safety is our #1 priority, followed closely by having fun... ...and we all know it's no fun when someone gets hurt.


- Obey all AMA and Club Guidelines.
