#### Double Yellow Line / No Fly Zones

The double yellow line is <u>NEVER</u> to be crossed. <u>DO NOT</u> fly over the motor cycle tracks when in use. <u>DO NOT</u> fly unnecessarily close to any of the power lines.

#### Fire Extinguishers and Staging

As a follow up reminder, every pilot is **<u>REQUIRED</u>** to have a fire extinguisher staged and ready to be used in an emergency, please don't leave it in your car. If left at home, it should be treated the same as if you forgot batteries or your TX. **Don't Fly.** 

#### Safety Reminders I shouldn't even have to publish again...

No flying under the influence.

No smoking in the pits.

Be courteous of your Prop/Jet Blast.

No "hands off" Taxing into or out of the pits.

Pilots are **<u>Required</u>** to be in pilot stations, behind fences while flying. Communicate anytime someone has to enter the active runway area. (eg. Landed aircraft retrieval or filming)




