IF YOU HAVEN'T RENEWED YET TO GET THE 2021 GATE CODE, PLEASE DO SO NOW.



It is with great sadness that I inform our club of the passing of another one of our long time members. Bob Gillam passed away on December 24, 2020. He was 83. He will be laid to rest with full military honors in Denver, Colorado so he can be with his family. RIP Bob. His daughter Valerie will be clearing out his model airplane collection that consists of various planes, motors, wood, kits and tools to raise money for Bob's final expenses. On February 2, 3 & 4^{th} , she has offered to open Bob's home to CCF members to give us an opportunity to take possession of whatever he has in his collection. It won't be a garage sale, but more of "donations are appreciated" meeting as she just wants the members that Bob always spoke so passionately about to give his collection a good home. FAA released their Final Rule for Remote ID at the end of December. As atrocious as the original proposal was, the final rule was actually not that bad, all things considered. Let's face it, the FAA was going to impose on our hobby one way or another and I believe they took into account all the responses they received during public comment. As it stands, CCF will apply, with the assistance of the AMA, to become an FAA Recognized Identification Area (FRIA) which will allow our members to fly at Deleo Field without having to have a remote ID broadcasting module in the aircraft. Even this FRIA registration compliance requirement is 30-months out so we have time to prepare before mid-year 2023 to register as a FRIA site.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR 2021

- FIRE EXTINGUISHERS ARE MANADORY AT THE FIELD. Please bring a fire extinguisher when you fly.
- WEAR YOUR CLUB BADGES AT THE FIELD.
- <u>CLUB MEMBERSHIP DUES</u>, <u>APPLICATION FORM</u>, <u>AND FAA REGRISTRATION NEED-ED</u>. Your 2021 Club Membership Dues must be paid prior to February 1st if you want to maintain your membership in the club and flying privileges. You can give your payment to the Ethan Marsh, Club Secretary, pay on the website, so send a check (not cash) to CIRCLE CITY FLYERS, P.O. BOX 78732, CORONA, CA 92877. Please fill out and submitted your application form with any updated information. Don't for to include your AMA and FAA Registration Number. Once you pay your membership dues you will receive the new gate lock combination for 2020.
- <u>SLURRY FUND</u>. If you haven't paid your Slurry Fund Donation of \$100 then please do so. The Slurry Fund was initiated in 2018 and some members <u>have not contributed to it yet or have not paid the full amount</u>. You can pay on GoFundMe website, or give your check to a club officer, or mail it to CIRCLE CITY FLYERS, P.O. BOX 78732, CORONA, CA 92877. The monies collected will be used to slurry the runway which is estimated to cost between \$6k to \$7k. We need to make the repairs now before we find ourselves without a runway! It was reported that only 6 out of 62 members have paid the full \$100 amount.
- <u>CLUB MEETINGS</u>. Our club meetings are the 3rd Saturday of the month and held at the field. Meeting time is 11AM and it usually lasts for 1 hour. Most of the time we have a small raffle. There is no flying permitted during the club meetings. If you have any issues or concerns then please come to the meeting and express them.
- NO INITIATION FEE FOR 2021. Our club approved to drop the \$60 Club Initiation Fee for 2021. This makes joining the club a great deal for new members.



He served in the U.S. Army and loved his country. Bob was known for his love to build and fly model airplanes and tell jokes to whomever would listen. Born in Oklahoma and raised in La Verne, CA, he was beloved by his community. Bob is survived by his son and daughter, Greg Gillam and Valerie Watne; his grandchildren, Kyler, Morgan, Haden, Jon Callan and Corinne; and his best four-legged friend, Boogie. Bob will be laid to rest with full military honors at Fort Logan National Cemetery in Denver, Colorado.



The Boggie Story. To end 2020, I want to share a story of a little dog named Boogie. Boogie was a rescue Papillion/Terrier that was found in a small cage, kept on the side of the house of a couple who struggled with hoarding. They kept Boogie in a cage for their grandchildren to pet when they visited, but Boogie became aggressive and no one wanted to be near him. Rightly so, Boogie couldn't trust humans.



My father had a house that backed up to Boogies home, separated by an alley. He noticed what was going on and often would go and check on Boogie. After a few months, my father was able to talk the couple into releasing Boogie into his care. Unsure of how the trauma would manifest itself in this pup, my father used careful techniques to gain trust and begin rehabilitation. Boogie soared!

He ran free in my father's home and yard from that day forward. He learned to take long car trips for vacations; play in parks; lakes; and became the sidekick to my father when flying airplanes (photo). Boogie was my father's best friend and became the neighborhood buddy. On Christmas Eve 2020, my father passed away. Boogie was left in his home in California, scared and confused, alone... all the while being slightly blind and deaf. It broke my heart being so far and unable to scoop him up and take him to CO with me due to his fragile state.



However, being a foster for FAS, I knew the heart and compassion animal foster families have. So, I put out an SOS - explained Boogie's story, his age and his vulnerability, the love we have for him... hoping someone would give this eighteen-year-old Papillion/Terrier a chance. I had FIVE animal shelters step up within an hour. Who would have guessed there are animal fosters for senior animals only! Boogie was whisked away with a kind family within the second hour of my plea. Then, the next day I was told Boogie had a forever home - the senior dog foster family wanted to see him through the remainder of his life. There is no greater joy than to know Boogie is hugged, loved and cared for. May the new year bring you peace, love and joy.

HELPFUL FIELD AND CLUB HINTS WHILE AT THE FIELD

- Obey all AMA and Club Safety Rules.
- In case of fire at the field, call 911 immediately. If fire crews appear, either by truck and/or by air, immediately cease flying and ground your aircraft. All emergency responders, fire and law enforcement, are given priority to combat any and all threats that endanger life, property and the safety of individuals. Please do your best to assist and not be part of the problem.



• All members are required to have an ABC Fire Extinguisher at the field when they fly located in the pit area. Fly safe and be safe. Bring a First Aid Kit as added protection.



- Our field is in an area populated by wildlife including snakes. Please be aware of this danger and act accordingly when walking in the brush.
- Please pickup your trash before leaving the field and dispose of it in trash containers
 or if needed take it home with you.
- Fly with a buddy! Sometimes having an extra set of hands and eyes are helpful.
